Levin Fire Station is home to two brigades: the Horowhenua 184 urban Fire Brigade and the Levin 184 urban Fire Brigade. Both brigades play an essential part in keeping our community safe.

We're looking for more people to join our brigades. If you're a fit and healthy person, we'll have a great time working together.

Two crews with different specialties

There are many different roles and responsibilities for our volunteers. You can be a driver, a firefighter, a pump operator, or a fire engine operator.

Both brigades respond to medical incidents, major and minor accidents and other requests from people in need.

As well as volunteer firefighters, we also have operational support and brigade administration roles.
